Position description

The Department of Medicine of McGill University invites applications for a full-time position as a member of the Contract Academic Staff as a clinician-scientist at the rank of Full Professor.

The candidate will also be appointed to clinical practice in the Department of Medicine, Division of Gastroenterology and Hepatology at the McGill University Health Centre (MUHC). The incumbent will also be the Director of MUHC Inflammatory Bowel Disease (IBD) Center at the McGill University Health Centre.

The Department of Medicine is a leader in academic medicine, our educational and research missions support excellent and innovative clinical programs across our teaching hospitals. The McGill University Health Centre is one of McGill's major teaching hospitals affiliated with the Faculty of Medicine at Canada's internationally renowned McGill University, located in the vibrant and multicultural city of Montreal, in the province of Quebec.

Job Duties

The job duties will include covering the gastroenterology consult service, on call duties, inflammatory bowel disease and general gastroenterology outpatient clinics. The successful candidate is expected to lead the academic and research mission of the MUHC IBD Centre. The clinician-scientist, based primarily at the Montreal General Hospital site of the MUHC, will devote a minimum of 50% time to research and will lead the academic and research program in inflammatory bowel disease.

The candidate is also expected to be actively involved in all aspects of McGill's academic mission (teaching and supervision of clinical trainees, graduate students and involvement in academic and administrative committees) and will be expected to demonstrate a commitment to equity, diversity and inclusion in these activities.

Qualifications and Education requirements

Candidates must hold an MD degree and must have completed subspecialty training in Gastroenterology and certified by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada (or equivalent), as well as be eligible for licensure in Quebec and certified by the Collège des médecins du Québec. Candidates should have experience in research as well as clinical expertise in inflammatory bowel disease and endoscopy and have strong leadership qualities, a proven track record in basic and/or clinical research.

All candidates must be fluent in English with a working knowledge of French.
