

The Division of Gastroenterology at St. Paul's Hospital seeks a gastroenterologist who specialises in IBD.

The candidate must have completed more than 1 year of advanced IBD training beyond core gastroenterology training. In addition, they should have a postgraduate degree at a Masters level or higher. A minimum of 4 years of practicing medicine as a consultant of advanced IBD care at a major IBD centre in the world is mandatory.

Candidates must have demonstrated a leadership role in setting up and running a young adult transition clinic and have been actively involved in a pregnancy in IBD service. Further leadership should be demonstrated in both young adult transition and pregnancy management by being involved in national or international guidelines regarding these two specialty's services.

Candidates should be actively involved in research activities with a focus on the impact of the microbiome on IBD and have demonstrated research interest focused on improving the quality of IBD care. Candidates should be trained in reading capsule endoscopy and have completed or started training in intestinal ultrasound for use in the management of IBD.

The successful candidate must be eligible to be licensed to practice as a Gastroenterologist in the Province of British Columbia.

The successful applicant will show demonstrated potential in teaching and will be expected to participate in the undergraduate as well as postgraduate teaching activities of the Division and Department.

It is anticipated that the successful candidate will be appointed as a clinical faculty member in the UBC Division of Gastroenterology, Department of Medicine.
