Position description

The Department of Medicine of McGill University invites applications for a full-time position as a member of the Contract Academic Staff as a clinician-scientist at the rank of Assistant Professor. The candidate will also be appointed to clinical practice in the Department of Medicine, Division of Gastroenterology and Hepatology at the McGill University Health Centre (MUHC). The candidate will join the hepatology group which consists of 4 full-time academic hepatologists at the Royal Victoria Hospital of the McGill University Health Centre.

The Department of Medicine is a leader in academic medicine; our educational and research missions support excellent and innovative clinical programs across our teaching hospitals. The McGill University Health Centre is one of McGill's major teaching hospitals affiliated with the Faculty of Medicine at Canada's internationally renowned McGill University, located in the vibrant and multicultural city of Montreal, in the province of Quebec.

Job Duties

Job duties will include covering the Hepatology and Gastroenterology consult services, rounding on the liver transplantation service, outpatient general hepatology, portal hypertension and liver transplant clinics as well as on call duties. As a clinician-scientist it is expected that the candidate will devote a minimum of 50% time to research and will apply for external personal support from the appropriate funding agencies (i.e. CIHR, FRQ-S).

The candidate is also expected to be actively involved in all aspects of McGill's academic mission (teaching and supervision of clinical trainees, graduate students and involvement in academic, research and administrative activities) and will be expected to demonstrate a commitment to equity, diversity and inclusion in these activities.

Qualifications and Education requirements

Candidates must hold an MD degree and must have completed subspecialty training in Gastroenterology and certified by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada (or equivalent), as well as be eligible for licensure in Quebec and certified by the Collège des médecins du Québec. Candidates should have completed a fellowship in Hepatology of at least 1 year duration. Candidates should have training and experience in managing all aspects of liver disease and particularly in portal hypertension and including liver transplantation. The candidate must have a strong commitment to patient care and have clinical and teaching skills. Essential functions required include gastroscopy, colonoscopy, endoscopic management of bleeding and non-bleeding portal hypertensive GI lesions, transient elastography of the liver and spleen.

All candidates must be fluent in English and French.
